We had a good spring with cooler than usual temperatures and dry conditions which made fishing opportunities plentiful, and there was an abundance of fish to be caught. With July came the summer heat and will remain with us for a while longer – August usually has some of the hottest days of the year. The dog days of summer requires us

to yield caution for both us (the fisherman) and the fish. As the temperatures stay high and the nights don't cool down too much, the water temperatures soar and that means the fishery can be tough on those finned friends that we catch. PLEASE, exercise good habits when catching fish. If you plan to release it, get it in fast, don't prolong the fight and tire the fish out. When you get it to the boat, try to release it in the water without handling it. If you

do have to bring the fish in the boat to get a picture or remove a deep-set hook, do it as quickly as possible. The more stress you put on a fish, the lower the survival rate and this is even more critical in the hot summer months. Our fishery in the Chesapeake Bay and Hampton Roads has a lot to offer in variety, and quality as a fishery. It also takes a beating from us as fisherman. We need to consider the resource and protect it everyway possible. That can start with a good practice of catch and safe-release for the fish you do not intend to keep.

If you have not noticed, Chris Viano has organized a club fishing tournament that began in the beginning of the year. It is a friendly competition that will

not offer a spot in the Wide World of Sports hall of fame or a guest spot on the local fishing circuit. It is meant to be fun and a challenge to target specific fish and provide a motivation to get on the water and fish. Please take advantage of the challenge and put some lines in the water. Take some pictures for the newsletter and dinner slideshow presentation. The

experience is meant to improve your skills as a caster and thus a fisherman (or woman). There will be club recognition and small prizes for the leaders in each category at the annual dinner. Let's get out, wet your lines and put some numbers (and pictures) on the board.

Our August meeting will be an event we have not have for a long while. We will have an equipment buy, sell or trade! You can bring in your used gear that is no longer being used

This issue we explore a topic that is often requested - knots. You only need to know relatively few knots on the water for fly fishing. I generally use a nail knot for everything except tying the fly to the tippet. The I incorporate a perfection loop, or an improved cinch knot. Once in a while I might try a new knot just to get familiar with it or see if it is easier to tie, but I always end up using the same tried and true knots for me. This site has been around for a while and is very usefull in learing the basics and more. Find and master your favorite knot and be confident that your equipment will hold up for that fish of a lifetime.


AUGUST GENERAL MEETING

TAKE ACTION



Jaclyn, we need your help to bring back striped bass and protect the Chesapeake Bay.

The public has three weeks to officially comment on each of two petitions in Virginia to protect Bay health from menhaden reduction fishing, and safeguard the striped bass, red drum, and other fish and wildlife that depend on this critical forage fish.

The industrial menhaden fishery currently uses purse seine nets that extend deeper than the actual bottom depth of much of the Bay, damaging seagrass habitats while preventing the escape of gamefish that feed on menhaden. The fish are sucked into the mothership while the resultant nutrient-laden, oxygen-deprived, contaminated water is discharged overboard.

To protect Virginia's nearshore habitat and sportfish populations, TRCP is gathering and submitting comments from those in support of petitions to better regulate these actions. The reduction fishing industry is harming the largest striped bass nursery on the East Coast. To make your voice heard, take action at the link below.






VCFA FISHING TOURNAMENT






Chris Malgee: entry for fishing contest - STRIPED BASS
